# The story

- -Soering was a German immigrant
- Met a Canadian girl in College
- -Allegedly killed her parents 1985
- Soering and Haysom Went to England 1985
   where they where arrested for cheque fraud





# The story

- 1986 indicted with capital murder and the US requested extradition
- 1988 The UK granted extradition
- Soering presented a complaint to the European Commission of Human Rights and later to the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR)
- 1989 The ECHR decided that the UK could not extradite him if the death penalty would be applicable

#### 1. The Soering Case



- The decision of the ECtHR
  - Breach of Article 3 ECHR due to "death row phenomenon"
    - "No one shall be subjected to torture or to inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment"
  - Application of Article 3 to Extradition Cases if there is a real risk that a person will be subject to consequences that would fall under Art. 3 – "extraterritorial application" of the ECHR
  - Applicable if the conduct proscribed by the ECHR would take place in a foreign country following extradition

#### The decision of the ECtHR

- Art. 3 makes no provision for exceptions and permits no derogations. It is an absolute prohibition
- Third Party States may not be subject to ECHR obligations
- BUT States Party to the ECHR may be held responsible for that violation if he extradites the person where there is a real risk of violation of Art. 3 (substantial grounds for believing that the persons cencerned, if extradited, faces a real risk of being subject to torture or to inhuman or degrading treatment")



#### The decision of the ECtHR

- there was a real risk that the death penalty could be imposed (the Commonwealth's Attorney had stated that he would request the death penalty)
- "death row phenomenon" = "inhuman or degrading?"

"it depends on all the circumstances of the cases, such as the nature and context of the treatment or punishment, the manner and method of its execution, its duration, its physical or mental effects and, in some instances, the sex, age and state of health of the victim"

### Length of detention prior to execution

"just as some lapse of time between sentence and execution is inevitable if appeal safeguards are to be provided to the condemned person, so it is equally part of human nature that the person will cling to life by exploiting those safeguards. However well mentioned [the post-sentence procedures] ... the consequence is that the condemned prisoner has to endure for many years the conditions on death row and the anguish and mounting tension of living in the ever-present shadow of death"





#### Conditions on death row

Stringency of the custodial regime together with the length of time (average 6 to 8 years).

## Soering's age and mental state

18 years old

Suffering from abnormality of mind as substantially impaired his mental responsibility for his acts (*folie à deux – shared psychosis*)





# Possible extradition to Germany

Relevant because it balances the interest in criminal punishment and protection against inhuman or degrading treatment and contributes for assessment of proportionality of the extradition decision.



#### The decision of the ECHR - Conclusion

"having regard to the very long period of time spent on death row in such extreme conditions, with the ever present and mounting anguish of awaiting execution of the death penalty, and to the personal circumstances of the applicant, especially his age and mental state at the time of the offence, the applicant's extradition to the United States would expose him to a real risk of treatment going beyond the threshold set by Article 3"

#### Outcome

- The U.K. government obtained further assurances from the U.S. regarding the death penalty before extraditing *Soering* to Virginia. He was tried and convicted of the first degree murders of the Haysoms and, on 4 September 1990, sentenced to two consecutive life terms. He is serving his sentence Virginia.
- Haysom did not contest her extradition from the U.K. and pleaded guilty to conspiring to kill her parents. On 6 October 1987, the court sentenced her to 45-yearsper-count to be served consecutively.

#### **EXTRADITION PROCEEDINGS IN PORTUGAL:**

- FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES
  - DEATH PENALTY (ABOLISHED IN PT)
  - No extradition for Political Reasons
  - LIFE SENTENCE
  - Non-Extradition of Nationals
  - JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS
- ADMINISTRATIVE STAGE/JUDICIAL STAGE



# THE COURT'S DECISION PROCEEDINGS NO. 759/11.0YRLSB-3 — LISBON COURT OF APPEALS — 3RD SECTION — JUDGMENT OF 17.11.2011 WWW.DGSI.PT

- 1. Portuguese Citizenship
- 2. Time elapsed since the events not compatible with
  - a. the statutory limitation period in the PT Crim. Code
  - b. principle of fair proceedings and the requirement for legal certainty under Portuguese Constitution



# 3. Incompatibility with the constitutional principles of Portugal concerning criminal sanctions:

- a. criminal sanctions must be for the purpose of deterrence and social integration and not for retribution
  - i. Over 40 years since the crime
  - ii. Person totally integrated in the community of the requested Staten
  - iii. No connection to the country requesting extradition
  - iv. Crime committed when the defendant was eighteen years old
  - v. Severe consequences that extradition would have for such an elderly person



"... it makes no sense to extradite a man (who's health has deteriorated and who is socially integrated in Portugal, where his family lives; who needs permanent caretaking from his family and who has worked and has participated is social volunteer projects) in the winter of his life in order to highly likely see him die incarcerated (in a country from which he was absent for 40 years) and far away from his family, all of this because of a crime that he committed when he was a young 18 year old boy"
